Japan - A Country with Frequent Earthquakes

The number of earthquakes is quite high in Japan. Most of them are small in scale, but major earthquakes can cause extensive damage, such as the collapse of buildings and fires. To minimize the damage, it is essential to be prepared on a daily basis.

Response to An Earthquake

- (1) Secure your personal safety.
- (2) Quickly turn off all potential fire sources.
- (3) Ensure an escape route by leaving a door or window open.
- (4) If something is on fire, extinguish it as soon as possible.
- (5) Remain calm and Do not rush outside.
- (6) Stay away from narrow roads and block walls.
- (7) Beware of landslides.
- (8) Evacuate on foot. Do not use a car.
- (9) Cooperate with your neighbors and help children, the elderly, the sick or injured to evacuate as well.
- (10) Correct accurate information.



Three Stage of Evacuation Information

- (1) Alert Level 3: Evacuation of the Elderly, etc.
 - ⇒ People who may have difficulty evacuating quickly, such as the elderly, people with disabilities, and families with infants and toddlers, should proceed to evacuate themselves.
- (2) Alert Level 4: Evacuation Instruction
 - ⇒ All residents should evacuate from affected areas.
- (3) Alert Level 5: Emergency Safety Measures
 - ⇒ This indicates a life-threatening situation in which you can no longer safely evacuate.
 - Take immediate action to protect yourself.

***Please evacuate before Alert Level 5 is issued.**

Types of Tsunami Warning / Advisory

Japan Meteorological Agency (*Kishocho*) issue 3 types of forecasts on tsunami.

(1) Tsunami Advisory (*Tsunami Chuiho*)

⇒ Expected level of the tsunami ... $0.2 \text{ m} \leq h \leq 1 \text{ m}$

(2) Tsunami Warning (*Tsunami Keiho*)

⇒ Expected level of the tsunami ... $1 \text{ m} \leq h \leq 3 \text{ m}$

(3) Major Tsunami Warning (*Otsunami Keiho*)

⇒ Expected level of the tsunami ... $3 \text{ m} < h$



Preparing for a Disaster

Prepare a stockpile of daily necessities and emergency items as follows:

Things to Remember While at Evacuation Sites

- (1) Everyone can be mentally unstable. Try to help each other.
- (2) Follow the instructions of city officials.
- (3) Don't be misled by rumors; get accurate information.
- (4) Keep maintaining good health and hygiene.

Evacuation Sites & Areas

Kisarazu City has 54 designated evacuation sites (*Hinanjo*), including schools and community centers. An additional 19 places, such as parks, are designated as emergency evacuation areas (*Hinanbasho*). To avoid confusion in an emergency, please check the nearest evacuation site with your family.

Difference between Evacuation Sites & Areas

(1) Evacuation sites = *Hinanjo*

Emergency shelters from rain and wind, and facilities where you can stay temporarily.

E.g.) schools and community halls

(2) Evacuation areas = *Hinanbasho*

Places to evacuate to in the event of earthquakes and fires.

E.g.) parks, sports ground
