A food drive is a form of charity in which food that is not needed at homes is donated to welfare facilities and people in need.

If you have intact, unopened food items at home, bring them to the Clean Center.

[Practice the 3010 Movement!]

Eat at your own table for the first 30 minutes and the last 10 minutes of social dinners and receptions to eliminate leftovers and reduce food loss.

Other things you can do

Let's eliminate food loss.
Plan before shopping (to prevent overbuying).
When eating out, order just the amount that you can eat (to prevent uneaten food).

Eligible food products

- Unopened items with an expiration date of more than 2 months from the current date.
- Items that can be stored at room temperature.
- Refrain from donating alcoholic beverages.

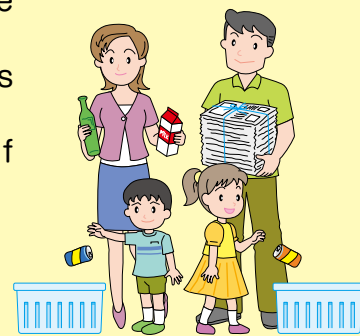
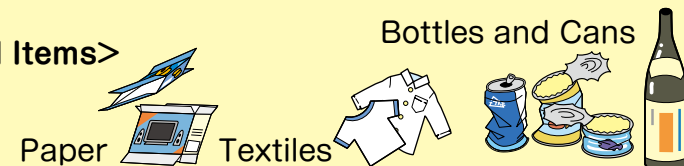
[Help With Group Collection of Recyclable Garbage]

Group collection of recyclable garbage is a voluntary activity that involves collecting paper and other resources generated from households and handing these over to a collection company registered with the city, performed by groups such as neighborhood associations, women's associations, senior citizen clubs, PTAs, and more.

★POINTS★

- ① Register with a group in advance.
- ② Participants will receive 2 types of subsidies: money from the collection company for the purchase of the collected items and a subsidy from the city based on the number of items collected.
- ③ Having everyone in the group work together on a task helps foster the local community.
- ④ This raises individual awareness of the importance of recycling.

[Subsidy for the Purchase and Installation of Composters and Food Garbage Disposers]

To dispose of food garbage (e.g. compost), consider using a composter or food garbage disposer.



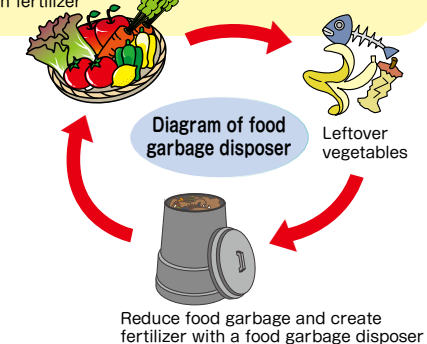
★POINTS★

- ① Can be used to produce fertilizer for home vegetable gardens.
- ② Reduces the odor of food garbage and leads to reduced garbage.

<Subsidy Requirements>

- ① Must be purchased at a store designated by the city.
※ Items purchased online or outside of designated stores are not eligible.
- ② Application must be made within 1 year of purchase.
- ③ Must have an address and live in the city. Individuals with no outstanding tax payments.

Use the product of the food garbage disposer as a home garden fertilizer



Garbage That Cannot Be Disposed by the City

The city does not collect or accept garbage that cannot be disposed of at city facilities, such as hard or large items, harmful or toxic items, hazardous items, or items that must be recycled under the Home Appliance Recycling Act.

Cautions

The following are examples of items that are difficult to dispose of properly. In addition to the items listed below, note that items deemed difficult to dispose of properly, such as plants and tree branches over 80 cm in length, Gas Cylinders, Spray Cans, and other pressurized Cans with remaining content (without holes drilled) or other items not in accordance with garbage disposal rules, house equipment (tatami mats, sinks, etc.) generated from renovation work, items that emit extremely foul odors, and items that are significantly large in volume or weight will not be collected. Examples of items that are difficult to dispose of properly

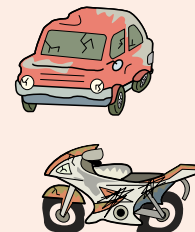
Natural items

Rocks, sand, gravel, soil, ash, etc.
※This includes not only natural items but also those sold as commercial products.



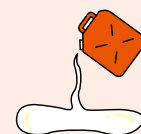
Hard items Large items

Gypsum board, exterior wall materials, roofing materials, concrete products, automobiles and motorcycles (including parts), tiles, roofing tiles, bricks, asphalt, bathtubs, water heaters, solar panels, bowling balls, FRP (fiber-reinforced plastic) products, fireproof safes, surfboards, machinery for agriculture, forestry and fishing, etc.



Liquid items

Oil, garbage oil, gasoline, kerosene, paint, etc.



Harmful, toxic, or hazardous objects

Items containing mercury (e.g., thermometers), poison, pesticides, home medical garbage (potentially infectious items), rechargeable batteries, button batteries, car batteries, lithium-ion batteries, etc.

For disposal of items that are difficult to dispose of properly, consult with the store where you purchased the product, a store that carries the product, a general garbage collection contractor licensed by Kisarazu City (see page 21), or a garbage disposal company.

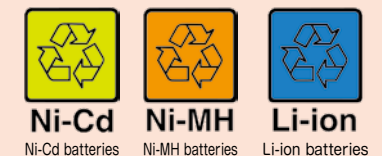

※Dry cell batteries are Non-burnable garbage. Put them in the bag designated for Non-burnable garbage.

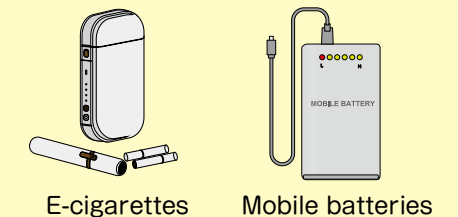

Cautions

Lithium ion batteries are dangerous and can cause a fire in garbage collection vehicles! Do not dispose of them with ordinary garbage.

Items using lithium ion batteries that can be disposed of when brought directly to the Clean Center



[Personal Computers]

Check the website of the respective computer manufacturer and request collection/recycling.

Computers with the mark shown on the right can be collected by the manufacturer.



Custom-built computers or computers produced by manufacturers that no longer exist are also eligible for recycling.

※There are items subject to the law in addition to those listed above.
Association for Electric Home Appliances Recycling Voucher Center (<https://www.rkc.aeha.or.jp/>)

Under the Home Appliance Recycling Act, recycling of these items is mandatory, and they are not collected or accepted by the city.
Consumers are required to pay for recycling.

Disposal Method① Ask the Store of Purchase

If you are replacing the item or if you know the shop where you bought it, consult directly with the shop.

Disposal Method② Bring to a Designated Location

If you can transport it yourself, you can bring it to a designated location and request disposal.

STEP1

For home appliances you are disposing of, check the:
① manufacturer name
② the size of the screen for TVs and the capacity for refrigerators/freezers, then go to the post office.

STEP2

Pay the recycling fee at a nearby post office.
※Fees vary depending on manufacturer, size, etc.
Check the fee at the post office.

STEP3

Bring to the [designated collection location]

Disposal Method③ Request collection from a Kisarazu City general garbage collection and transportation licensed contractor.

If you are unable to ask the store of purchase to dispose of the garbage or transport it yourself, ask a general garbage collection and transportation contractor licensed by Kisarazu City.

Do not use illegal garbage collectors other than a general garbage collection and transportation contractor licensed by Kisarazu City.

Put Garbage in Its Designated Bag!

● Designated bag for Burnable garbage/Designated bag for Non-burnable garbage

Garbage disposal fees are charged through the **designated bags for Burnable garbage** and **Non-burnable garbage**.

Bags not marked "General Garbage Disposal Fee Paid" on the upper right corner of the bag cannot be used.

Designated bags for Plastic containers and wrappings and designated bags for Glass Bottles, Cans, Plastic(PET) Bottles do not require a disposal fee because they help recycle resources.

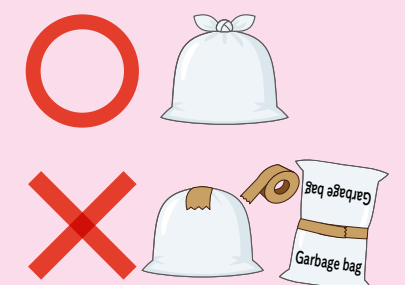
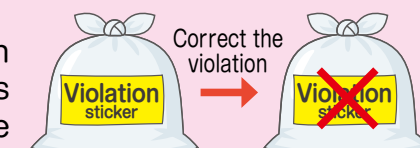
● Using Garbage Bags

- Put garbage into a single designated garbage bag, tie the bag tightly, and put it in the designated area.
Do not tape the opening of the bag or join 2 or more bags together.

Garbage that does not fit into a single designated garbage bag that can be tied shut is classified as Oversize Garbages.

- Place a large X over the violation sticker once the violation has been corrected to reuse the garbage bag.



Can be reused if the violation sticker is marked with a large X!

About Garbage Stations

[Precautions for Use and Management!]

- ① Garbage stations are the responsibility of all users.
Follow the usage rules to keep your neighborhood clean.
- ② If you are unsure which garbage station to use, ask your neighbor.
Do not use a garbage station without the consent of the users who manage the station.
- ③ **Garbage stations are shared by about 10 households.**
New garbage stations cannot be established for individual homes.
- ④ Notification to the city hall is required for the establishment, relocation, or discontinuation of garbage stations.

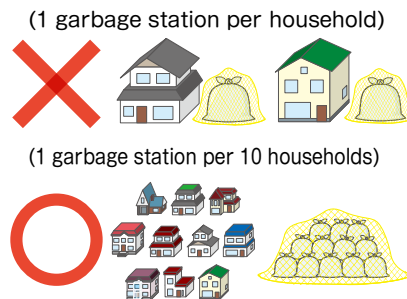
Garbage Station Establishment, Relocation, and Discontinuation Procedures

- ① **Discuss** the establishment, relocation, or discontinuation of a garbage station **among all users.**

Items to Check Before Submitting a Request

• When establishing or relocation a garbage station

- ☒ About 10 households will use the station now or in the future. (Only when establishing a station)
- ☒ Permission has been obtained from the owner of the adjacent land.
- ☒ Not located inside or right next to a public facility, such as a park.
- ☒ The location allows garbage collection vehicles to pass and stop smoothly and does not hinder the collection process.
- ☒ Not located near an intersection or other unsafe spot during collection.
- ☒ Cleaning duty and other management issues have been agreed upon.



• When discontinuing a garbage station

- ☒ Not only the applicant but all users have consented to the discontinuation of the station.

- ② A representative shall **submit a Garbage Collection Station Notification** to the City Beautification Promotion Division.

※When establishing or relocating garbage stations, submit the notification at least 10 days before the intended start date of use (a map can be obtained at the City Beautification Promotion Division).

- ③ If on-site inspection is required to establish or relocate a station, a staff member from the City Beautification Promotion Division will conduct an on-site inspection after Step ② to determine the suitability of the garbage collection station from the standpoint of safety and efficiency of garbage collection then contact the applicant. If the location is deemed inappropriate, return to Step ① and reconsider the location with the other users.

- ④ **Get ready to start using** the garbage station by the collection start date.

- Notify the intended users (inform users when stations are discontinued as well).
- Prepare a net and other necessary items. There are no subsidies from the city. Users are required to prepare these items on their own.
Do not use plastic buckets or other items that may obstruct traffic.
Using a net is recommended to prevent problems caused by crows and other animals (available at home centers).
If problems persist, take additional measures, such as using a fine mesh net or a double layer of netting.
- The city (including contractors) is not responsible for any damage or contamination to garbage bins during collection.

Garbage stations will be discontinued if they are not managed properly.

Garbage Station Usage Rules

Always take out your trash by 8:30 am!!



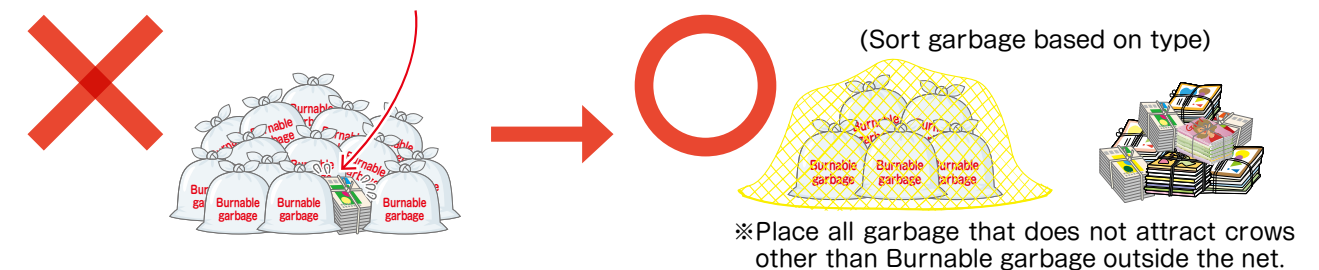
- ① **Take out garbage by 8:30 am on the specified collection day.**

Garbage taken out after 8:30 am will not be collected. (This is a city-wide rule!)

Do not assume that on days where more than one type of garbage is collected, that you still have time because the collection trucks come at different times.



Collection vehicles also collect different types of garbage, so be sure to sort garbage properly. Bags that were hidden may be left behind.



- ② **Sort garbage correctly and put it in the designated garbage bag.**

Garbage that has not been sorted or placed in its designated garbage bag and Oversized Garbage will not be collected.

Users are asked to dispose of any garbage that cannot be collected.

- ③ **Each household may dispose of up to 3 bags of designated garbage and up to 3 bundles of pruned twigs.**

- ④ **Cleaning of garbage stations is to be performed by its users.**

The city (including contractors) is not responsible if a garbage station becomes dirty due to problems such as crows.

Users are asked to take necessary measures such as double netting to prevent damage from crows and other animals.



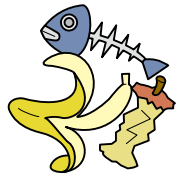
Burnable garbage

Twice a week

- Only **Burnable garbage** will be collected on national holidays; however, garbage collection is unavailable at the beginning of the year (January 1-3).
- Put garbage into a single designated garbage bag, tie the bag tightly, and put it in the designated area.
- Garbage made primarily of **paper, wood, or plastic (excluding containers and wrappings)** is generally considered **Burnable garbage**.



- Kitchen garbage (drain well)
Vegetable garbage, fruit peels, shells, leftovers, etc.



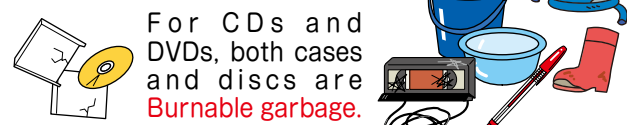
Soak cooking oil in cloth or paper and put out with the **Burnable garbage**.

- Paper scraps, paper products, textiles, leather, and wood products that cannot be recycled into resources.



※ Flush any excrement from disposable diapers down the toilet.

- Plastic and vinyl products (not ♻️ labeled)



For CDs and DVDs, both cases and discs are **Burnable garbage**.
※ When throwing away a high volume of cassette tapes and videotapes, place about 20 in a plastic bag and put them out with other Burnable garbage.

- Grass, leaves, twigs, etc.

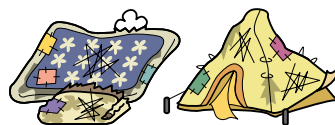


Throw it out in the designated bag.
Branches that do not fit into the bag should be bundled with a general garbage disposal ticket (Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket).

※ Up to 3 bundles can be put out at a time

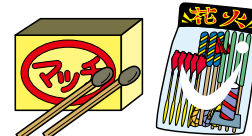
- Futons, mats, and other sheet-like items

Fold, tie with a wire or sturdy rope using a cross knot, and then put in a designated garbage bag.



- Fireworks, matches, and other flammable items

Soak them thoroughly in water before putting them out, regardless of whether they have been used.



Garbage Containing Metal or Other Parts Classified as **Non-burnable garbage**

Sort based on the main material of the item.

Example 1) When throwing away a clothespin hanger

- When the hanger is made of plastic and the clothespins are made of metal → **Burnable garbage**
- When the hanger is made of metal and the clothespins are made of plastic → **Non-burnable garbage**

Example 2) When throwing away shoes

- Shoes and sandals with some metal parts → **Burnable garbage**
- Shoes and sandals with many metal parts → **Non-burnable garbage**

Disposing of Pruned Twigs

- Home garden plants that do not fit into the bag can be disposed of at the garbage station with a general garbage disposal ticket (Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket).

General garbage disposal ticket (Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket)



※ The price is ¥40 per ticket or ¥200 for a set of 5 tickets.

※ The price of the Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket shown here is not the cost of the ticket but the general garbage disposal fee.

※ Refunds cannot be provided once the fee has been paid.

※ The ticket labeled "¥200" is a receipt.

This cannot be used as a Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket.

How to Dispose of Twigs Using the Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket

STEP 1

Length: 80cm or less
Thickness: 15cm or less

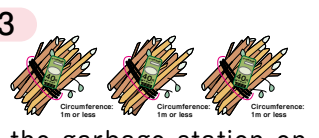
Cut one tree branch into pieces no thicker than 15cm and no longer than 80cm.

STEP 2

Bundle the cut branches with a strong rope or wire so that the circumference is no larger than 1 meter, and attach one Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket to each bundle.



STEP 3



Place in the garbage station on Burnable garbage day. Each household can put out **up to 3 bundles per collection day**. Bundles without the Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket will not be collected.

Branches and twigs brought directly to the Clean Center do not need a Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket, but must be bundled together as described above.

Do not use for timber, such as boards!

The **Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket** can only be used for the twigs and branches of home garden trees. It cannot be used for wood products such as disassembled furniture parts. Sort these items into Burnable garbage or Oversized Garbage to dispose them.

Do not use for industrial garbage!

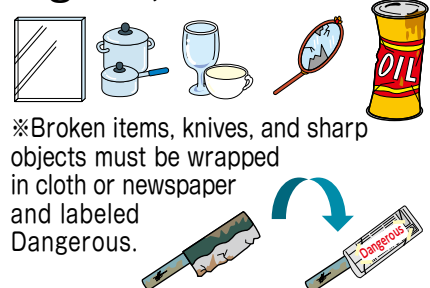
As with other garbage, pruned twigs produced by a company cannot be disposed of at a garbage station. Even garbage from a household garden tree cannot be disposed of at a garbage station when trimmed by a company because it counts as industrial garbage.

Non-burnable garbage Twice a month

- No collection on holidays.
- Put garbage into a single designated garbage bag, tie the bag tightly, and put it in the designated area.
- Garbage made primarily of **ceramic, metal, and glass** is generally classified as **Non-burnable garbage**.



●Ceramics, metal products, glass, mirrors

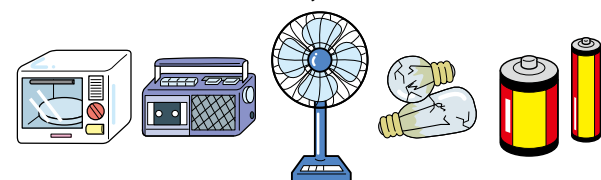


※Broken items, knives, and sharp objects must be wrapped in cloth or newspaper and labeled Dangerous.

※Soak the unused contents of oil Cans, paint Cans, or similar items in paper or cloth and put them out with the **Burnable garbage**!

Do not put out a large number of items.

●Electrical appliances, single-use batteries, etc.



※Microwave ovens, rice cookers, vacuum cleaners, fans, VCRs, cameras, electric heaters, lighting equipment, telephones, and other items that can be processed by the city are limited to those that can fit into a single garbage bag.

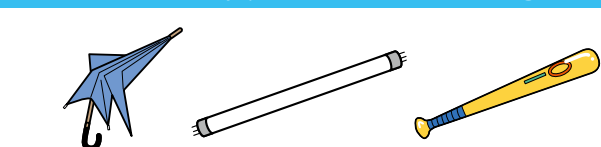
●Metal and glass products that cannot be recycled, such as bottles, Cans, Plastic (PET) Bottles

Metal Cans and Glass Bottles that contained things that people and animals cannot eat (bath salt Cans, cosmetic bottles, etc.), metal caps and lids, dirty bottles, Cans, heat-resistant Glass Bottles, milk bottles, pans, kettles, etc.

Only the following three types will be collected, even if they protrude from the bag.



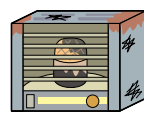
※Umbrellas, fluorescent tubes, and baseball bats are the **only exceptions**. Other items that protrude from the designated garbage bag are classified as Oversized Garbage.

Do not put out as Non-burnable garbage!

- Oil stove ●Oil heater
- Oil fan heater

These are considered Oversized Garbage, regardless of size!

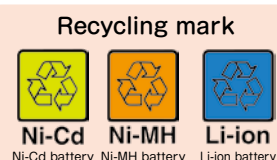

Do not put out rechargeable batteries or button batteries!

Put it in the collection box of a cooperating store location.

For safety, insulate each battery with cellophane tape.



The city does not collect or accept these items!

- Products subject to the Home Appliance Recycling Act, such as air conditioners, TVs, refrigerators, and washing machines, personal computers (those ineligible for the Small Home Appliance Recycling Program), cars, motorcycles (body and parts), rechargeable batteries, syringes, fire extinguishers, concrete, etc.

How to Dispose of Gas Cylinders, Spray Cans, and Lighters



- Place in a designated garbage bag with other Non-burnable garbage. Remove Gas Cylinders when disposing of a tabletop gas stove.
- Follow the rules to ensure the safety of everyone putting out garbage and to prevent fires and other accidents in garbage collection trucks and at the Clean Center garbage disposal facility.

How to Dispose of Gas Cylinders and Spray Cans

- ①Check whether it is empty and if not, use up the remaining content.
- ②If you are unable to use all of the gas, release it outdoors in a well-ventilated area away from open flames.
For cassette gas cylinders, remove the cap, face the tip downward, and press the tip against concrete. Once the gas stops coming out, shake the cylinder, and if there is no sound, it means the cylinder is empty.
Spray Cans are sold with a device to easily release the gas inside the can.
- ③After ensuring the can is empty, drill or punch a hole, **leave it outside in a well-ventilated place for a while**, and dispose of it as **[Non-burnable garbage]**.

※Make sure the can is empty before drilling a hole in it.

The reason you are asked to drill a hole is because this makes it easier for the garbage collector to confirm that there is no gas or other substance left inside. **This is not meant as a way to drain the gas inside.**

Attempting to drill a hole with gas still inside **may cause sparks, igniting the gas and causing an explosion**. Even if the gas does not catch fire, there is a risk that the pressure will cause the gas to burst and enter your eyes. Do not do this.

How to dispose of Lighters

- ①Press down the lever in a well-ventilated outdoor area free from fire. Blow out any fire.
- ②Press and hold the lever down with a rubber band or strong adhesive tape.
You will hear the blowing sound indicating the gas is released.
- ③Leave outdoors for half a day to a full day.
- ④Make sure that no gas is released when the lever is pressed and it does not ignite, then dispose of it as **[Non-burnable garbage]**.



Glass Bottles, Cans, Plastic (PET) Bottles

Once a week

- No collection on holidays.
- Rinse the inside lightly to remove all content before disposal.
- Put Cans, Glass Bottles, Plastic (PET) Bottles into the designated garbage bag regardless of color, shape, or size. Sorting will be performed after collection.
- Only items that contained food or drink** safe for human and animal consumption are eligible.

Notes on Sorting

✗ Dirty items, Glass Bottles, Cans, Plastic (PET) not included in this category should be sorted as follows.

Glass Bottles and Cans→**Non-burnable garbage**

Plastic (PET) Bottles→**Burnable garbage**



●Glass Bottles

Remove the cap

Plastic caps→**Plastic containers and wrappings**

Metal caps→**Non-burnable garbage**

Colorless and colored Glass Bottles can be put out together.



●Cans

Those with an aluminum or steel can recycling mark.

Cooking oil, confection, and pet food Cans can be disposed of as well.

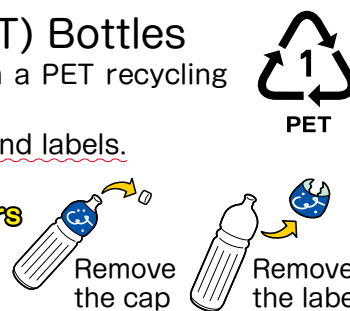

Separate Plastic (PET) Bottles from Plastic containers and wrappings!

Plastic (PET) Bottles

Transparent bottles made from PET (polyethylene terephthalate).

Standards require that plastic bottles made from PET be clear and colorless and that their contents are harmless for human consumption, such as beverages or seasonings, so that they can be recycled.

While bottles made from PET fall under the category of plastics, they are made specifically to be recyclable and as such are collected separately from other plastics.



Plastic containers and wrappings

These are plastic items that were used as containers or wrappings for selling products.

Although they are similar to plastic bottles made from PET, **plastics that are colored or contain cosmetics or detergents are considered Plastic containers and wrappings.**

Plastic bottles without a recycling mark are categorized as **Burnable garbage.**

Caution

Products made from plastic are **Burnable garbage**, not Plastic containers and wrappings. CD cases, videotapes, plastic hangers, etc.



Medical garbage cannot be disposed of as plastic

Syringes and IV bags cannot be thrown away as Plastic containers and wrappings. Accidents at treatment facilities have occurred because of this. For medical garbage disposal, return the item to the hospital that prescribed it.



Magazines, Books, Other printed materials, Card board, Milk and juice packaging

Oversized Garbage

- Items that do not fit in a single designated bag with the top closed are classified as Oversized Garbage.
Large items that can be disassembled and cut into small pieces that fit in a single designated bag with the top closed can be disposed of as **Burnable garbage** or **Non-burnable garbage**, depending on the material (except items that cannot be processed by the city).
※ Oil fan heaters, oil stoves, and oil heaters are classified as Oversized Garbage regardless of size.
- Anything that cannot be processed by the city will not be collected.
- Items longer than 2.5 meters cannot be processed by the city.

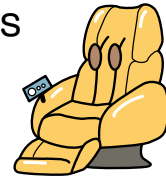

How to Dispose of Oversized Garbage

- Use one of the following methods to dispose of Oversized Garbage.



1. Make a reservation for door-to-door collection

Reservation by telephone is required. Call the City Beautification Promotion Division (inside the Clean Center ☎ 0438-36-1133) to confirm the collection date, garbage disposal fee, and pick-up location.

Note for reserving garbage pick-up

- ※ For Oversized Garbage pick-up, there is a fee of ¥800 per item, regardless of size.
Although the fee is ¥800 per item regardless of size, depending on the type of garbage, one set can be considered a single item (e.g., ¥800 for a set of 3 futons).
- ※ **Garbage collectors cannot enter your building or its premises to work. Place garbage outside near the road for immediate loading onto the collection truck.**
- ※ Up to 6 items can be collected at a time. When throwing away many items, make a separate booking the following week. Do not put out additional garbage on the day of collection.
- ※ The day of the collection is determined based on the area where you live. **Garbage collection time cannot be specified.** However, those who wish to be at home on the day of collection and pay the garbage disposal fee directly in cash can request morning or afternoon collection.
- ※ Make a telephone reservation at least 2 days before the collection date.
- ※ The city does not provide a door-to-door pick-up for Non-Oversized Garbage. Consult a general garbage collection and transportation contractor licensed by Kisarazu City (see page 21 for details).

How to Make a Reservation by Telephone

① **Call the City Beautification Promotion Division to confirm the collection date, garbage disposal fee, and pick-up location.**

※ When making a reservation by telephone, clearly state the pick-up location.



② **Purchase an Oversized Garbage Disposal Ticket where it is sold.**

※ Those who are home at the time of collection may pay in cash, meaning there is no need to purchase a disposal ticket.

※ The places where the Oversized Garbage Disposal Ticket is sold are **the same as those where the Pruned Twig Disposal Ticket is sold.** (For details, see page 11)

How to Dispose of Oversized Garbage

- ③ Those who are not at home at the time of collection, enter your name and collection date on the **Oversized Garbage Disposal Ticket** and attach it to a visible location.



※Do not throw away the receipt until collection is complete.

- ④ Put the Oversized Garbage at the location specified when making a reservation by 8:30 am on the collection day.

- House Entrance, parking space, etc. ○Apartment complex Parking lot, entrance, next to the garbage station, etc.

※Garbage is not collected within apartments.

Oversized Garbage disposal fee

The Oversized Garbage disposal fee is ¥800, regardless of size.

Bicycles, cupboards, snowboards, sofas (separable ones count as one item each), trouser presses, desks, tables, bed frames, bed mattresses (with springs), strollers, bookshelves, sewing machines, mochi rice makers, etc.

Some items can be collected as a set for a fee of ¥800, as shown below.

3. Request a Kisarazu city general garbage collection and transporter to collect the garbage.

If you cannot dispose of your Oversized Garbage using either of the methods above, contact a general garbage collection and transportation contractor (private) licensed by Kisarazu City.

Do not use illegal garbage collectors other than a general garbage collection and transportation contractor licensed by Kisarazu City.

When bringing garbage to the Clean Center


Only garbage generated in Kisarazu City will be accepted.

※Your driver's license or other identification will be used to verify your identity and disposal location.

On-site inspection of garbage may be conducted as well.

Caution

If you do not follow the rules, your garbage will be refused.

- ① **Saturdays require reservations** (for details, see page 23). Weekdays do not require reservations.
- ② Contact the center beforehand if you have a large amount of garbage or are unable to bring in the garbage yourself, otherwise it will be refused or will not be disposed of until on-site inspection is complete.
- ③ The drop-off location is different for each item. For easy unloading, separate Burnable garbage, Non-burnable garbage, and Oversized Garbage before bringing in your garbage.
- ④ **Unload your garbage yourself. Bring someone who can unload the garbage from your car.**
- ⑤ For pruned twigs and branches, cut each branch to under 15 cm thick and 80 cm long, then tie with a sturdy string or wire so that the bundle is within 1 m in circumference.


※Do the same for gutters, PVC pipes, wood, etc.
- ⑥ Roll or fold sheets, hoses, ropes, and similar items to under 80cm in circumference and fasten with a wire.
- ⑦ When bringing in own garbage, place in a transparent plastic bag (maximum capacity of 90L) so that the contents can be checked. Designated garbage bags are not required. You will still need to pay a processing fee even if you bring the garbage in a designated garbage bag.



●For general household garbage

The garbage disposal fee is ¥200 for up to 20 kg. ¥65 will be added for each additional 10 kg. (Amended April 1, 2021)

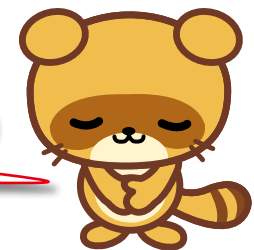

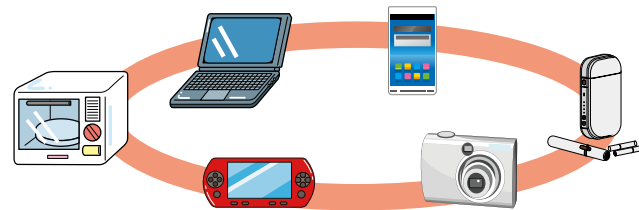

Free Drop-Off of Small Household Appliances

As of April 1, 2014, the Clean Center accepts small household appliances under 40 cm long on each side that were used at home free of charge.



● Examples of accepted items
Microwaves, mobile phones,
e-cigarettes, irons, toasters, etc.

※ Remove batteries

Drop-off days and times : Mon. - Fri.(excluding Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays, and year-end and New Year holidays)
8:30 am - 4:00 pm

× Unaccepted items

- Appliances longer than 40 cm on each side
- Items used outside the home (offices, etc.)
- Items subject to the Home Appliance Recycling Act (air conditioners, TVs, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, dryers)
- Disassembled home appliances
- Computer CRT displays
- Batteries, dry cells, light bulbs, etc.

※ Since small home appliances cannot be returned once collected, erase all data from devices containing personal information (cell phones, computers, video cameras, game consoles, car navigation systems, etc.) before bringing them in.

Contact the City Beautification Promotion Division inside the Clean Center for more information.

Free Distribution of Fertilizer

The Clean Center transforms leftover school lunches from city-run daycare centers and elementary schools into fertilizer and distributes them for free.



Try using this for your home flower beds or vegetable patches.

Distribution days : Every Tuesday, 9:00 am - 11:00 am (Unavailable on rainy days)

※ Fertilizer is not distributed on national holidays and during the year-end and New Year's holidays (December 29 - January 3)

Location : Clean Center, Kisarazu City

- ★ Bring your own bags and containers to put the fertilizer in.
- ★ The components of the fertilizer are tested once a year.

Garbage From Fires and Natural Disasters

The disposal fee for garbage generated from fires, earthquakes, typhoons, flooding, and other disasters will be reduced or waived when brought to the Clean Center provided that a Fire Disaster Certificate or Disaster Notification Certificate has been issued.

[Requirements for Reducing or Waiving Disposal Fees]

※ The type of garbage and method of transportation are the same as ordinary garbage. Items that are difficult to process will not be accepted.

Example : Branches and trees

Tie branches no thicker than 15 cm and no longer than 80 cm into a bundle with a circumference of 1 m or less.

※ **Contact the City Beautification Promotion Division inside the Clean Center before bringing in garbage.**

For fires

- ① Obtain a Fire Disaster Certificate from the fire department.
- ② Bring the Fire Disaster Certificate (original) and discuss a date for on-site inspection by the City Beautification Promotion Division. (Contact the city hall before your visit to make the process smoother)
- ③ A member of staff from the City Beautification Promotion Division will conduct an on-site inspection and provide guidance on how to bring garbage to the Center.
- ④ Bring garbage along with the Fire Disaster Certificate (original) to the Clean Center.

For natural disasters

Obtain a Disaster Notification Certificate from the Emergency Management Division of the Kisarazu City Office. An original copy of the Disaster Notification Certificate is required for procedures.

An on-site inspection may be required before bringing garbage to the Center, so contact the city beforehand.

Depending on the disaster, a deadline may be imposed upon the Disaster Notification Certificate for garbage disposal. During a disaster, notifications will be posted on the city's official website, brochures, and more.

Garbage Collection in Bad Weather

Garbage collection is generally carried out even in bad weather, such as during a typhoon or snow. However, garbage collection may be delayed or canceled due to road conditions, such as collapsed roadsides, overflowing rivers, flooded roads, or snow buildup. We ask for your cooperation in taking out garbage on the next scheduled collection day during stormy weather or when stormy weather is expected.



Alphabetical Classification Guide

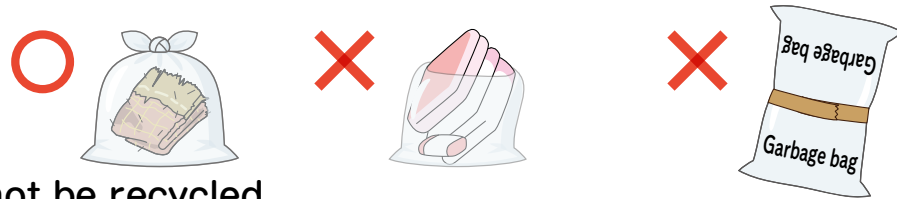
Before You Read: Important Tips for Sorting!

① Items that do not fit in the bag are classified as Oversized Garbage!

Items that do not fit in a single designated garbage bag with the top closed are classified as Oversized Garbage. Do not combine two or more bags to dispose of garbage.

Large garbage can be disassembled, cut, and put out in a single designated garbage bag.

*Items subject to the Home Appliance Recycling Act and oil stoves, oil fan heaters, and oil heaters will not be collected even if they are disassembled. Home appliances that have been dismantled to the point where they are unrecognizable will not be collected.



② Dirty items cannot be recycled

Items that are extremely dirty cannot be recycled even if they are classified as recyclable. Throw such items away with either Burnable or Non-burnable, depending on the material.



③ When classification is unclear, sort based on the main material of the item

If an item has both Burnable and Non-burnable parts or is otherwise difficult to classify, sort according to the main material.

Example 1) When throwing away a clothespin hanger

- When the hanger is made of plastic and the clothespins are made of metal → **Burnable garbage**
- When the hanger is made of metal and the clothespins are made of plastic → **Non-burnable garbage**



Example 2) When throwing away shoes

- Shoes and sandals with some metal parts → **Burnable garbage**
- Shoes and sandals with many metal parts → **Non-burnable garbage**



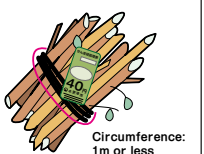
④ Consult the store of purchase for items not collected by the city.

Items classified as Not Collected in the Alphabetical Classification Guide cannot be disposed of at garbage stations or the Clean Center.

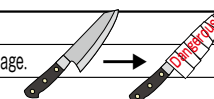

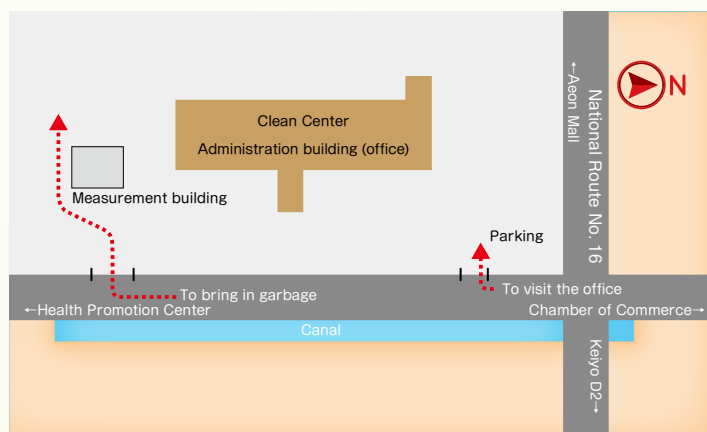
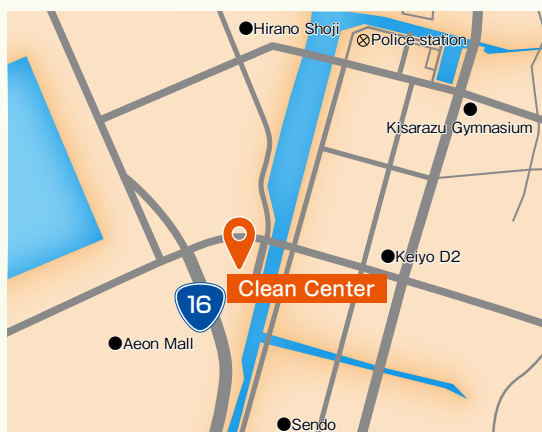
